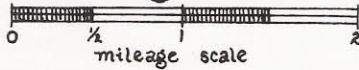

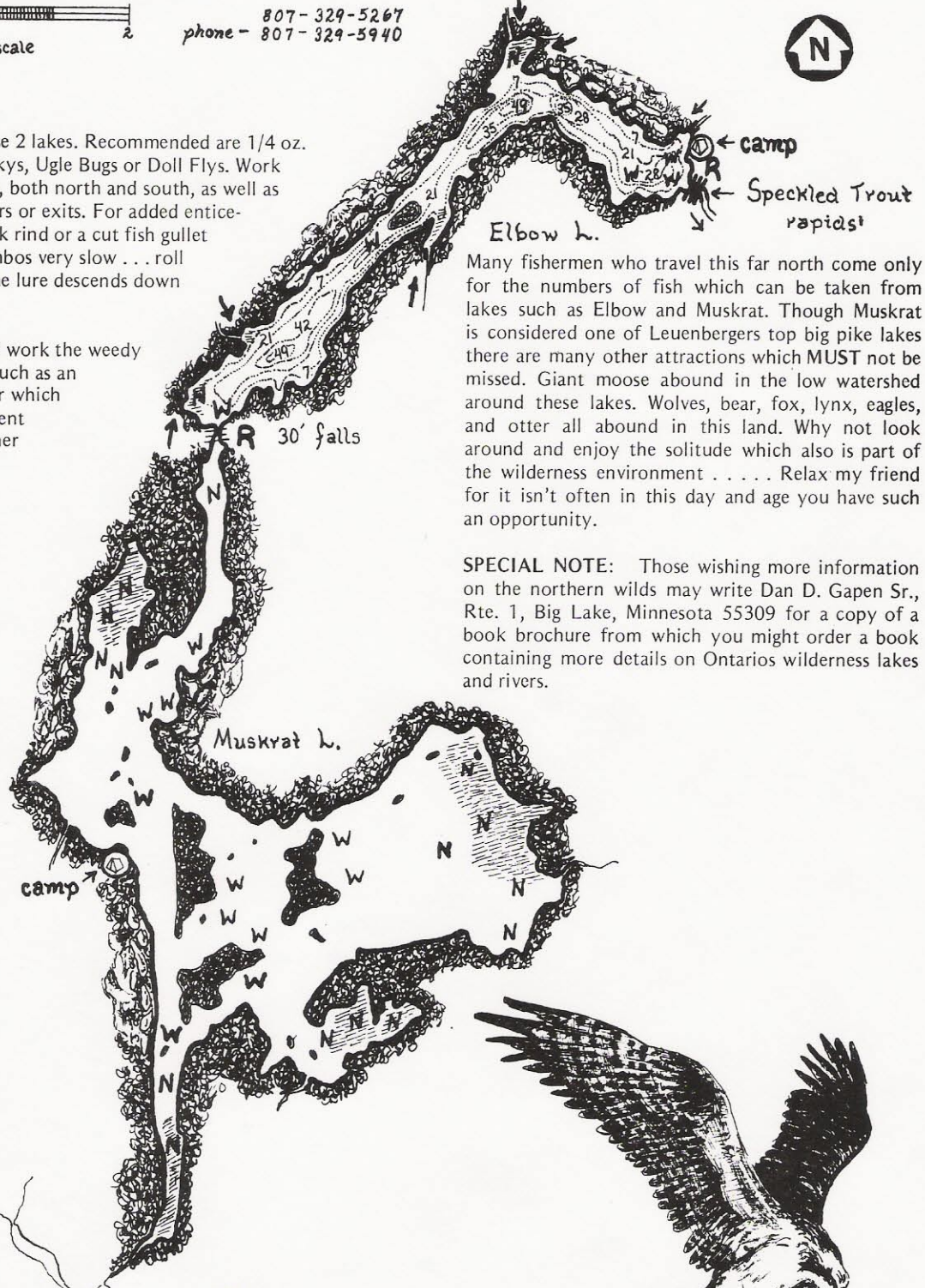
How-to Fishing Tips;

Walleyes love yellow jigs in these 2 lakes. Recommended are 1/4 oz. size in name brands such as Pinkys, Ugle Bugs or Doll Flies. Work the steep shore slopes of Elbow, both north and south, as well as those areas where the river enters or exits. For added enticement place a piece of white pork rind or a cut fish gullet to the jig hook. Work these combos very slow . . . roll your rod tip ever so gently as the lure descends down the lakeshore rocky slopes.

Northern Pike fisherman should work the weedy bays noted with flashy spoons such as an Eppinger Daredevil. Spoon color which works best are those in fluorescent oranges, reds and yellows. Spinner baits such as an 'Ugly Buzz' in black with orange blades are also deadly on large pike.

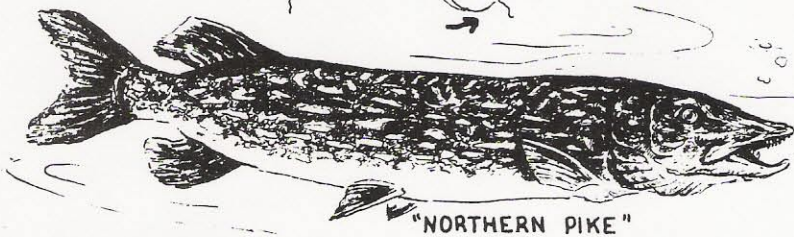
Many fishermen who travel this far north come only for the numbers of fish which can be taken from lakes such as Elbow and Muskrat. Though Muskrat is considered one of Leuenbergers top big pike lakes there are many other attractions which **MUST** not be missed. Giant moose abound in the low watershed around these lakes. Wolves, bear, fox, lynx, eagles, and otter all abound in this land. Why not look around and enjoy the solitude which also is part of the wilderness environment . . . Relax my friend for it isn't often in this day and age you have such an opportunity.
