HOW - To Fishing Tips;

Whitefish Lake produces many a trophy size northern pike and walleye over its 120 day season. The lake abounds in bottom structure as well as grassey bays where pike are seen to lie. The 8 man camp, located on the northern shore, is comfortable and equipped with propane stove and refrigerator. Bunk beds are provided with soft mattresses and spring supports. The lake is ideally located so that northern winds do not ever make it impossible to fish. Walleye size will average near 3 pounds with 7 pounders not uncommon. The biggest pike (1881) taken was a huge 33 pounder which struck a red and white spoon. Other pike reaching near the 30 pound mark are taken each year. Work the island and reef dropoffs for schooled walleye. Once a fish is located, continue to work the immediate area . . . more will be there, schooled up and feeding. Yellow, orange and black Ugly Bug or Cockroach Jigs in 1/4 oz. work best for walleye. In the spring and fall use these jigs in conjunction with L-shaped jig spinners. In mid summer do away with spinner and tip your offering with fish gullet, worms or pork rind.
